Year 7 Reading List 2023

Are you looking for a great book for your child's collection? The following list contains more than 50 longer and more difficult chapter books to appeal to children aged 11 – 12 in Year 7 of secondary school.

There is a range of fiction and nonfiction suitable for all ability ranges within this age group, including titles for both reluctant and more able readers. In all the lists, we feature books to appeal to a wide range of interests and situations.

Remember, that for children to keep wanting to read, they must enjoy reading. As they get older, they prefer to choose books for themselves and at times, they will choose books which are easy for them. You should not interfere if children range up and down in level of the difficulty of the books they read. No one likes to be challenged all the time.

This list of year 7 books is curated by a team of teachers and school librarians and includes stories by Lisa Thompson, Gillian Cross, Malorie Blackman, Philip Pullman, Michael Morpugo and Marcus Zusak.

Once your child has read and enjoyed an author, it makes sense to borrow or buy another book by the same author. Be careful, though, because some authors write for different age groups. Ask your school librarian or teacher for more help in this regard.
